Banquet: Rooms confirmed; AV ready; we need to order podium from physical plant; guest speaker Cathy Wurzer has permission from St. Thomas to sell her books and CDs. Motion: give Cathy a \$50 honorarium for speaking. Moved, seconded, and carried. The banquet is intended for members and their guests, since the club subsidizes almost half the cost of the meal. However, persons who join the club in April have a membership good through the club year 2012-2013.

Discussion of receiver site for Magic Repeater at our location: Tom Sturm has made it clear that any major repeater changes must involve students at St. Thomas and provide educational benefits to the school. It is suggested that the plan include a receiver site for us at the Magic location, which would allow students to work on the technical challenges of receiver voting, etc. Our former repeater is non-operational and the current repeater is on loan from Terry Londroche, NØGOI. Terry has a source that will donate to the SPRC a more modern repeater. We agreed to take him up on this and he will facilitate. We will need to purchase crystals for our frequencies. We will also need to obtain UHF link frequencies from the Minnesota Repeater Council. This is still a general plan and we will need to involve Tom and students from St. Thomas in the project details.

The program for the April meeting (on March 30) will be on Uninterruptible Power Supplies.

Possibilities for the program for the May meeting include a program from Skip, KSØJ, or one on amateur radio software.

Field Day – need a chairperson. Might Ed WBØVHF be willing again?

The Treasury is doing well. Members may contact Allan for details.

The Washington School project is back up, with at least 5 kids who are active and want to get licensed. John Hunt has been leading the effort but needs help. The class meets 1:40-3:00 PM on Tuesdays.

Allan is hoping that our Fall Technician class will be run through the city of St. Paul Community Ed. The Magic Yard Sale will be July 28, 8 -11 AM.

In May we will hold elections for President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. Some interest has been shown and more will be encouraged to come forward.


