FEBRUARY MEMBERSHIP MEETING

February 5, 2010 Socializing — 7:00 PM Meeting — 7:30 PM

The program will be by Brad Peters, WD9GNJ who is employed in the Emergency Management field, and currently serving as the Deputy Communications Officer for the: Minnesota Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management.

Brad's relationship with Amateur Radio has endeavored him to search for non-traditional forms of communication. He started his association with Echolink in 2006. exploring Echolink as a means for utilizing VOIP technology for linking repeaters and users over wide geographical areas. In 2007 he setup an Echolink node on the 147.03 repeater here in the Twin Cities. During the last 2 years, a link with the 147.03's sister repeater, the 444.875 repeater, (both are located on the same site) was established. Since Internet connectivity is nearly impossible at the repeater site, he opted to setup the remote type of RF Echolink to repeater connections.

At the February 5th meeting, Brad will share with all who attend, what he has learned from his experiences with Echolink, and provide the St. Paul Radio Club with any assistance in their endeavors to utilize Echolink for their needs. He will be providing a Power Point presentation in addition to the Verbal presentation, and allow for questions and answers session after the presentation.

SPRC OFFERING EXTRA CLASS

The St. Paul Radio Club is presenting an Extra Class upgrade program in February and March of 2010.

The classes will be held from 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm on eight Tuesday nights, beginning on Feb. 9 and continuing each Tuesday until March 30. The classes will be held in Roseville, at the Roseville Fire Station at 2701 North Lexington Avenue. That's a block north of the intersection of Lexington and County Road C. It's about a mile north of Highway 36.


The classes will use a "discussion group" format, rather than straight lecture. People will be expected to have read the chapter before the class. The book will be the ARRL License Manual for the Extra Class, 9th edition (green cover). It should be purchased in advance of the first class from either Radio City or ARRL.org. The retail price is \$24.95. Everyone should read Chapters 1 and 2 before coming to the first class on Feb. 9.
